Phone service estimate:

\$50/month up to 5 extensions

Extensions are phone call recipients, either physical phones, forwarded calls, or voicemail.

Ubiquiti UVP - \$200 – android interface Lease for \$50/month



Wifi phone - \$180 No lease option



These are only a few options. There

are many more. We have options on video conferencing, large touch screen interfaces, and various feature sets. These are just some we have worked with. Any of these phones will work identically on your desk, or from another location (house, hotel, etc.) with the appropriate internet and power connections. Connect via extension to remote locations as well.

Feel free to mix and match phones. For example, you could have full featured phones for some, and more basic phones for others, even a very basic phone for customer use.

Lots of options to choose from. Limited stock on some less expensive options.



Faxing

Fax service is an additional cost, but adds additional features as well. Faxes are always received and sent so faxes are nearly always transmitted. Additionally, it can be set up to email faxes or view them online as well. This does require a fax device that works with your fax machine. Fax device \$150 and service is an extra \$15/month.

Phone Service

The phone service includes voicemail (web based and email retrieval), intercom, call queues, voice menus (IVR), conferencing, call recording, and many other features.

Basic service has no contract. Phone leases can be converted to purchase for a small fee, and may contain an end of lease fee if less than 12 months.

Phone service is locally managed and locally serviced.

Phone numbers will need to be ported, but we handle all of that to make the transition as seamless as possible.
